

Two main stages in Scottish Education



Broad General Education (from age 3 to the end of S3)



Senior Phase (from S4 to S6 – but could be in school or college)

Broad General Education

From Age 3 to the end of S3.

To equip young people with the breadth and depth of education to thrive in the future.

Broad and balanced yet allows for choice and personalisation.

S1-S3 lays strong foundations and keeps options open for more specialised learning, qualifications and lifelong learning in the senior phase and beyond.

Senior phase at Meldrum Academy

Wide range of courses and levels on offer

Flexibility in the courses through college links and arrangements with other schools

Continued personal support

Wide range of events, programmes, competitions and extra curricular activities

Combined Senior Phase



The school timetable is setup so that S4, S5 and S6 can have the same choice of subjects.



This overall allows for a wider range of courses and levels including new courses and subjects.

Senior phase



Pupils moving into S4 will follow 6 courses in S4 (including English and Mathematics.



Pupils moving into S5 will follow 5 courses in S5.



Pupils moving S6 will select 5 options, which are not necessarily all SQCF courses.



There are options of courses available through NESCol (Aberdeen, Ellon, Fraserburgh)



Courses will lead to National Qualifications awarded by the SQA.

Qualifications



Pupils will follow courses and in some cases sit exams, at a level most appropriate to their own level of achievement and ability.



SCQF Level 1 – Level 7


Building up qualifications

Pupil build up a portfolio of qualifications, skills, achievements and experiences.

Greater focus on partnerships with colleges and universities, CLD, relevant work experience, other schools and volunteering in and out of school.

Greater focus on wider achievements both in and out of school.

Portfolio continues to be developed and added to after pupils have left school at work, college or university



Important points



The majority of S5 students and all in S6 are above the statutory school leaving age.



<u>Positive choice</u> to stay on at school.



Post 16 students are 'senior pupils' with responsibility of setting tone of school.



Students are expected to be responsible for themselves and the decisions they make








SCOTTISH NATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS - SCQF LEVELS AND TIMELINES



This table shows how current and old qualifications relate to one another in terms of their SCQF level. The SCQF level of a qualification provides a way of comparing how demanding or difficult the learning involved in achieving a qualification is. This table can be used by anybody with a need to understand National Qualifications (normally awarded at school), for example employers when recruiting. Young people get their information from a number of sources.








